I recommend printing on card stock and/or laminating these pages for durability. An alternative for some of the activities is to put the pages into page protectors, so that they are reusable.

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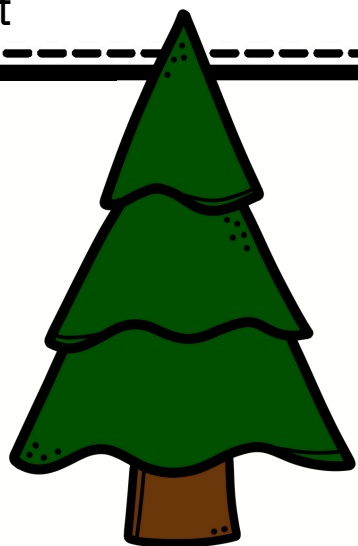
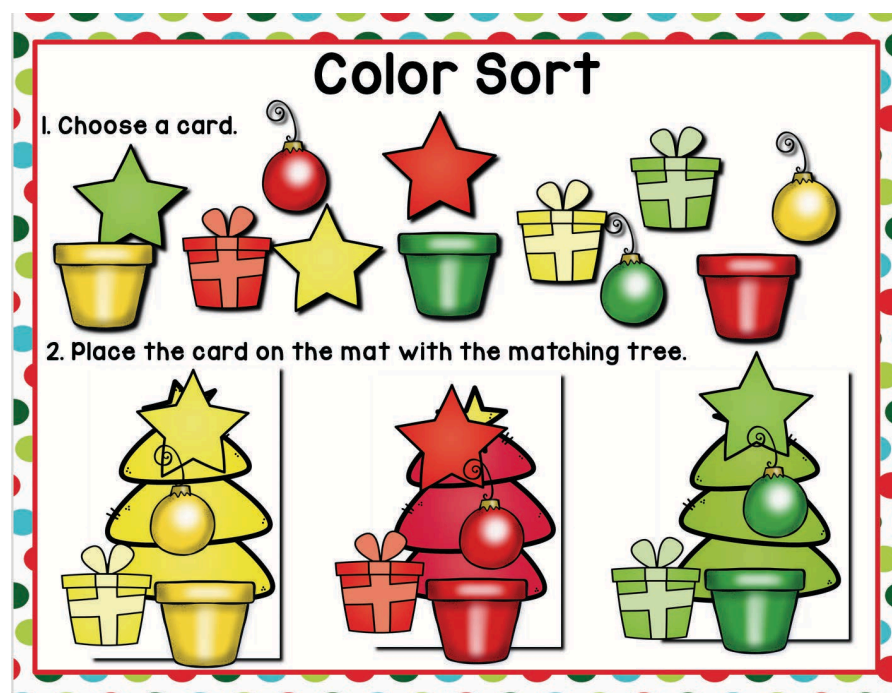
